Local Mentoring Program Coordinator to be honored at National Mentoring Month event

Wilmington, Del. – Barbara Jo German from Delaware School for the Deaf in Newark will be honored by **Senator Tom Carper** and Connecting Generations for her exemplary work as a volunteer mentoring program coordinator at Connecting Generations' annual celebration event, "Jazz in January" during National Mentoring Month. Exemplary Mentoring Program Coordinators were nominated and selected based on their outstanding volunteer service and helping Connecting Generations, home of the Creative Mentoring program, achieve its mission to help Delaware's children reach their full potential.

Barbara Jo German helped launch Delaware's first mentoring program for deaf students at Delaware School for the Deaf 7 years ago. She enthusiastically volunteered to coordinate the mentoring program with about 20 mentor/mentees and continues to maintain its success. Not only does Barbara Jo juggle her full-time duties as a speech therapist and complete all the normal duties of a coordinator, but she also screens mentors for their ASL signing abilities, helps educate mentors on issues relating to deaf culture, recruits new mentors each year, and arranges events and invites mentors to chaperone field trips.

A total of seven exemplary mentors and program coordinators will be honored on January 31st in addition to three other distinguished honorees: **Jane Maroney, Edward F. "Mike" Eaton and James Patton, Sr., who will receive the 10th Annual Robert A. Kasey, Jr. Lifetime Achievement Award.** This award is presented each year to individuals who have distinguished themselves through personal growth and contributions to individual and community development.

Connecting Generations will host "Jazz in January 2009" on Saturday, January 31, from 6:00 to 11:00 p.m. at the DuPont Country Club. January is National Mentoring Month and Jazz Education Month, and this annual event celebrates mentoring and raises funds for its mentoring and education programs, Creative Mentoring, Seasons of Respect, and Creative Transitions. Jazz in January, designed around a Jazz theme, will include an exciting silent auction, heavy hors d'oeuvres, and dancing to the Tim Laushey Jazz and Swing Band, which is back by popular demand. AstraZeneca, a long time supporter of Delaware children and education, is sponsoring the event.
